Tyler began composing during the beginning of his undergraduate studies, and has premiered three pieces during that time. He is known for being a fun, challenging, and thoughtful composer. His piece, Romance for Clarinet and



Piano, which premiered in Schleswig, IA, in 2017, was written for his friends, Jacob Metzler and Jena Nahnsen, and was well received as an exciting story told through music.

Tyler is studying flute under Dr. Sonja Giles. Tyler has performed in various ensembles at Iowa State including the ISU Flute Ensemble, the Amado Wind Quintet, the Amado Wind Trio, the Ames Children's Choir, the ISU Symphony Orchestra, the ISU Wind Ensemble, the ISU Statesmen, and the ISU Singers.
